Greg Jenkins, CPA, is Associate Professor of Accounting at North Carolina State University. He has published articles in *Auditing: A Journal of Practice and Theory*, *Internal Auditing*, *Journal of Accountancy*, *Journal of Business and Economic Perspectives*, *Journal of Forensic Accounting*, *Strategic Finance*, *The Journal of Applied Business Research*, *The CPA Journal* and *The Tax Adviser*. His primary research interests include auditor judgment and behavior and business ethics. Professor Jenkins is also a coauthor of *Comprehensive Assurance & Systems Tool*, an integrated practice set, contributing author of *Managerial Accounting: A Focus on Decision Making*, 3rd edition, and author of *The Enron Collapse*. He has more than ten years of teaching experience and has taught courses in accounting information systems, undergraduate and graduate auditing, business ethics, managerial and financial accounting principles, and a survey of accounting. Professor Jenkins has received the University Outstanding Teacher Award at North Carolina State University and is a member of the Academy of Outstanding Teachers.

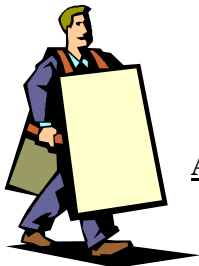
